

PROGRAM NOTE It Is Well by Barry Milner

- WORLD PREMIERE -

The commission for *It Is Well* sprang out of a conversation between Barry Milner and Scott Bersaglia as they decided a setting of *It Is Well* with My Soul was needed that was not a traditional arrangement. As they discussed the tragic events in the life of Horatio Spafford – in particular, the Great Chicago Fire of 1871 and subsequent loss of his daughters at sea – they determined the piece should portray those events while weaving the hymn throughout the composition.

It Is Well was commissioned to honor the faithful ministry of William (Bill) Haynes and his wife, Rhetta. An ardent defender of the faith and biblical expositor, Bill retired from full-time ministry in 2020 and is now Pastor Emeritus of Grace Baptist Church in Somerset, KY, a church he led from its beginning in 2006. Spafford's hymn was chosen as the source material because of Bill's love for its story and message. Commenting on the hymn, Bill reflects, "While many people turn inward during a traumatic event, Spafford turned to Christ for comfort and assurance. How does one sing 'it is well' when you have lost your family? The beauty of the song is that of Spafford's response: when the captain calls Spafford up to the deck and says, 'This is the spot where your children drowned,' Spafford immediately goes to his room and writes the hymn."

The commission consortium was led by the Sacred Winds Ensemble, Dr. Scott Bersaglia, Music Director. The consortium ensembles include Campbellsville University Wind Ensemble (Campbellsville, KY), Dr. Corey S. 

Proceed to the Route

We live in the age of GPS maps. Gone are the days of breaking out the *Rand McNally Road Atlas* to navigate through an unknown city. GPS has become quite a handy tool. However, the more I use my Maps app, the more I am reminded of the most frustrating, unhelpful instruction known to the navigation world: "Proceed to the route." Have you received this instruction? Do you know the problem with it? There is a reason you are using the Maps app—you don't know where you are or how to get where you want to go. So, to have the device tell you, "Proceed to the route," does not help you proceed to the route. I typically respond by telling my app, "I can't proceed to the route because I don't know where I am or how to get to the route!" So, there I am, driving aimlessly and talking to my Maps app as though he is going to sympathize with me until I happen to find the route.

You join us tonight for the Sacred Winds performance of John Bunyan's book, *Pilgrim's Progress*, a classic story of a man named Christian on a journey toward the Celestial City. It is a moving tale of a man traveling the route toward heaven, the Celestial City. And, it is a tale that beckons us each to join Christian along on the same journey—a tale instructing each of us, "Proceed to the route." However, fear not, I realize the call for you to proceed to the route to the Celestial City is useless if you don't know where you currently are. So, let's figure that out together.

First, let me catch you up on Bunyan's *Pilgrim's Progress* in case you haven't read it. It begins by telling of a man living in the city of Destruction, a place in which all its residents are doomed to suffer the torments of Hell. Having read and learned of his looming doom in his "book" (the Bible), he is filled with sorrow over his condition. However, a man named "Evangelist" comes to him and tells him the good news of the Celestial City (heaven) and how to get there—by entering through the "Wicket Gate." The man, who we learn is named "Christian," soon takes off toward the Wicket Gate leaving all behind in order to gain eternal life. However, he quickly realizes he has an immense burden upon his back—his own sin. This burden weighs him down more and more on his journey as he learns there is nothing in his power he can do to remove it. He meets various characters along his way to the Wicket Gate, some spurring him onward while others such as "Obstinate," "Legality," and "Mr. Worldly Wiseman" hinder his journey. He finally makes it to Wicket Gate where he enters and soon comes to the Cross where the burden from his back is removed and his ragged, journey-worn clothing is replaced by new attire. From here, Christian continues on his journey, traveling the road of life climbing the hill of difficulty, battling temptation in the city of Vanity Fair, engaging in a spiritual battle with Apollyon, and persevering through a time of imprisonment in Doubting Castle by the Giant, Despair. Ultimately, through many dangers, trials, and snares, Christian makes it to the Celestial City where he is brought into the presence of the King.

Pilgrim's Progress is a beautiful story of the very real situation we each find ourselves in today. Whether you realize it or not, we are all born as sinners living in the City of Destruction. Left on our own, the sure and certain punishment of God awaits us for our rebellion against his holy Law. None of us are immune; none can plead "innocent." We have all sinned. However, God has given us his Word—the Bible—and placed people in our lives to share the good news that Jesus, God's own Son, was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, died on the cross in our place for our sins, and rose from the grave in the defeat of death so that we might have our relationship with God restored and live eternally with him in heaven—what Bunyan called the "Celestial City" (John 3:16, 1 Corinthians 15:3-5). What makes this good news is that all who turn from their sins (repent) and confess Jesus as Lord in faith will be saved (Romans 10:9).

Now, let's get back to where we began—the issue of "proceeding to the route." In Matthew 7:13-14, Jesus taught, "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few." Here, Jesus makes clear that we each have a choice: Either choose the easy way with a wide gate leading to destruction or the hard way with a narrow gate leading to life. Living according to your own morality, efforts, achievements, and religion is the easy way that leads to destruction, for none of us can achieve the perfect holiness of God. However, our hope is that on this day you would understand the good news, just as Christian did in Pilgrim's Progress. What is this good news? It is simply that Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life—no one is saved but through faith in him alone (John 14:6). Yes, Jesus is the narrow gate by which we must enter in order to have eternal life and we enter through faith in him alone.

So, where are you? Are you a resident of the City of Destruction? Or, are you a pilgrim journeying toward the Celestial City? Are you seeking to walk the road of life with the burden of your sin weighing heavy upon your back? Or, do you know the peace, joy, and freedom of knowing your burden of sin has been lifted away by Jesus' death on the cross?

The instruction we have all been given by the Word of God is, "Proceed to the route." However, unlike our Maps app, God has told us exactly what this means: Proceed to turn from your sin and trust Jesus as Lord. In so doing, your feet will be placed upon the path to the Celestial City, your burden lifted from your back, and you can join the Christians gathered around you in this place in the journey. Will it be easy? By no means. Will it be popular? Probably not. Will it be worth it? By all means—and we invite you to join us!

Scott Bersaglia is Founder and Music Director of the Sacred Winds Ensemble and Founder and Chairman of Sacred Winds Ministries. He also serves Grace Baptist Church in Somerset, KY, as Pastor of Worship, a position he began in June 2022. About the Sacred Winds Ensemble

The Sacred Winds Ensemble is a wind band that consists of more than sixty volunteer musicians from across the United States encompassing a gifted body of musicians including instrumental music educators, students pursuing a music degree, private instrumental educators, music faculty in higher education, and professional musicians.

Founded in 1997 by Scott Bersaglia, the ensemble presents concerts focusing on the everlasting truth of God and His son, Jesus Christ. The ensemble's initial purpose was to provide an expansive musical compliment to the worship service of Petrey Memorial Baptist, the conductor's home church. Since then, the ensemble has unfolded into a ministering body spreading the Word of a sovereign and personal God.

The Sacred Winds Ensemble Commissioning Project was established in 2000 and encompasses works for wind, string, and choral ensembles. In 2007, David Maslanka was commissioned to write a work commemorating the group's ten-year anniversary. The result was *Unending Stream of Life*. In 2015, the ensemble recorded their first album, *In Christ Alone*. The album was recorded over two days in Lexington, KY, with three-time Grammy-award winning recording engineer, David Lau, of Brookwood Studios in Plymouth, MI. The album features four works from the ensemble's commissioning project.





The ensemble has performed at the Baptist Church Music Conference National Convention and twice at the Kentucky Music Educators Association State Music Conference. Additionally, the ensemble has been recognized by The House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for "proving itself as an outstanding asset to the community." Noted guest artists of the Sacred Winds Ensemble include Jerry Junkin, guest conductor; Teresa Alzadon, soprano; Judson Perry, tenor; Jody J. Nagel, J. Daniel Jenkins, Thomas Root, Craig Biondi, John Vander Gheynst, and the late David Maslanka.

The ensemble has garnered high praise from composers Donald Grantham, Jody Nagel, and David Maslanka, among others. Dr. Jody Nagel, whose work *Voyage of Discovery* is featured on the ensemble's album, writes, "Your recording of *Voyage* is brilliant! It is certainly THE definitive recording. I just listened to the CD in its entirety, and there's no doubt you have added a serious gift of music to the musical world." In commenting on the ensemble's performance of his final movement from the Symphony No. 7, David Maslanka wrote, "Your performances of the Symphony No.7 movement [IV] are very touching and beautiful. You have done fine work under very restricted circumstances. It is quite clear that your players are deeply involved in the music."

In 2018, Sacred Winds established partnerships in Guayaquil, Ecuador, with La Academia Musica Bautista del Ecuador for the training and teaching of music and worship to the church and the Conservatorio de Musica Cristiana Adoradores and the Universidad de las Artes to provide music instruction to students in Guayaquil.
